APELI, The COOP and Club International: What are they and what's the difference between them?

The **APELI** (Association des Parents d'Elèves du Lycée International) is an independent non-profit association run by parent volunteers. It strives to inform and assist parents and students at the Lycée International and its partner schools and it represents Lycée International parents at meetings with the Administration and the school's pedagogical team. Its mission is to facilitate the success of each child and enhance the school environment. The APELI organizes the annual Open Day; the Forum des Etudes (annual Higher Education Forum); Careers Day; June Activities (extracurricular activities for collège students who finish school each year at the beginning of June); OIB Graduation Ceremony; the school bus network; parent/teacher meetings; conferences; and student insurance.

The APELI publishes various periodicals including Liaisons-Rentrée, Regards, Liaisons and APELI-Transports. The office is located on the ground floor of Bâtiment E. For more information, please contact them at 01 34 51 35 46 or via their website: www.apeli.org.

The **COOP** association or "Coopérative" is managed and financed by the Lycée International parents. Its mission is to promote extracurricular activities for the students and to contribute to their fulfillment. It is an essential part of the Lycée.



It enables students to benefit from its activities:

- either by taking part in clubs (about 20)
- or by benefitting from services provided by the 'Coopérative': photocopiers reserved for students, costumes for plays, class photos, the organisation of conferences, outings after school, trips...
- or simply as spectators to shows put on by the 'Coopérative' and which are free of charge for all students and parents.

The COOP supports activities for all age groups: in the primary school, the COOP allocates a budget to each class for extra-curricular activities chosen by the teacher (Carnival, outings, etc); in the secondary school the COOP organizes the grand spectacle 'Légendes du Roi Arthur', The Jazz Band (conducted by Simon Lockwood), 'Le Grenier des Costumes', the Photography Club, Math Club, Theatre Club, the projects run by the CVL (Club de la Vie Lycéenne) such as the 'Journée des Terminales'.

The COOP office is situated in the hall of building E.

The 'Association des Amis du Lycée International de St Germain en Laye' has among its members mostly alumni but also ex-parents, members of the administration, teachers. Its purpose is to give to all those who were affiliated with the Lycée International a means of communicating with each other in order to maintain relationships. To accomplish this, the association has created a website "aalisg.com" where a database of almost 8000 names can be consulted. The **Greta** organizes adult language training and is part of the French National Education Ministry. Greta offers French classes: Français Langue Etrangère (FLE) at the Lycée International itself and all classes are open to parents who wish to learn French or to perfect their command of the French language. There are four class levels: beginner, elementary, intermediate and advanced. All classes are during the school term. Beginner classes are held 3 times a week for 2 hours each, the other levels are held twice a week also for 2 hours each. The classes touch on topics such as grammar, phonetics, French culture and history and include free guided tours of Paris (Assemblée Nationale, Hôtel de Ville, etc) and help create friendships between the participants.

Employment institutions in France

The French national institution that helps French-speaking foreigners with job-hunting in France is the Pole Emploi (since January 2009, merger of the previous ANPE and ASSEDIC).
